BRING PUBLIC ART PROJECT TO

PHOENIX, AZ (April 5, 2012) – The Children's Museum of Phoenix, along with the City of Phoenix and Phoenix Office of Arts & Culture will celebrate the new public art installation at the Museum, this First Friday Night, April 6th at 4:30pm.

The pubic art installation is the beautiful artist-inspired fence and gates facing the Museum, along 7th Street and Monroe. Called "*Pathways, 2012*", the public art was commissioned by the Phoenix Office of Arts & Culture Public Art Program. The project was funded through City of Phoenix Water and Cultural Facilities Capital Programs. The fence and gates were designed by Nicomia LLC Artists Mike Osborne and Tane Clark, with fabrication by E 2 Innovations, Inc..

The dedication ceremony will begin at 4:30pm. Speakers will include:

The Children's Museum of Phoenix is located in the historic Monroe School Building at 215 N. 7th Street in downtown Phoenix. The Museum opened to the public on June 14, 2008 and offers 45,000 square feet of hands-on, fun and educational activities for children ages birth to 10. The mission of the Museum is to engage the minds, muscles and imaginations of children and the grown-ups who care about them. The Museum is open Tuesdays through Sundays, 9am to 4pm. Admission is \$11 per person, children under the age of 1 are free.

AzTAP Department of Services for Persons with Disabilities conducted an accessibility evaluation in August 2008 and summarized, "the Children's Museum of Phoenix is the most exceptionally disability-aware arts institution this evaluator has ever surveyed."
