

Accommodations Statement 2023

Camp programs at The Children's Museum of Phoenix (CMoP), are committed to having a safe environment that is free of discrimination, violence, and bullying. Our Museum works to ensure that all campers have the opportunity to participate to their fullest potential and share a meaningful experience, with other campers and camp counselors.

This model allows us to operate as an inclusive camp, meaning we support campers on the spectrum and campers with disabilities; we aim to provide accommodations and support that could help them have a successful camp experience.

Reasonable accommodations are made for all individuals with disabilities appropriate to the needs of each individual. Campers are welcome to bring their own auxiliary aid (respite worker, behavioral aid, paraprofessional, etc.), to camp, as needed, throughout the program.

Should your camper require support in obtaining any auxiliary aids or services, we ask that you reach out to our camp team (camps@childmusephx.org), 4-6 weeks in advance, so that we have ample time to prepare and provide appropriate accommodations prior to the start of the camp program.
